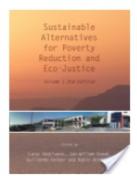

There are many calls nowadays for "New Thinking" or "Liquid Democracy" but it seems that we need to revisit also old concepts and traditional approaches. North American Indians were looking for approaches for settlements between tribes or in conflict resolution situations with the capital in Washington. The method is called "Structured Dialogic Design" and we have mentioned it also briefly in the paper about the SDGs. What is done is "Influence Voting" – let us call it informed decisions where you not do voting without knowing what it is about and how it relates to other issues – in contrast to "importance voting" where the importance is not questioned and related but subject to personal feelings, assumptions, estimations or even interests (possibly of "others").
